











































































#### THE S.T.O.M.P. REPORT

Swell! Sunshine! Offshore breezes! And the hottest field of loggers in the events 14 year history descended on Wollongong's finest location of class and sophistication for the 2015 STOMP.





Bellambi offered up a left that was barrelling (yes! barrelling...at times...) and a right that in classic Bellambi fashion kept you open on the outside to go for it and then the classic fading, fading and fading through the middle, awaiting a nice inside to work over. Friday afternoon was closing out on sets from the point to the Bombie and natives were getting restless. But by the first hooter Saturday morning it had dropped to shoulder/head high, gone offshore and turned on. Classic!

Competitors came from far and wide, including Northerners Jack Norton and Jye Byrnes and Victoria's Ben Considentine, covering the most distance to get there. Sydney's Northern beaches are always represented heavily at STOMP by legends such as the unstoppable Paul O'Grady, Lynden Riley, Flemo, Steve Beaumont and many others. Flemo apparently cut a rug at the bowlo Friday night, wooing a young lady of 85 with his dance moves.

Good to see Chojnacki down to add some Northern beaches style and flair. Shellharbour's DV8's, with team Brown Dogg brought a strong contingent of surfers along and a few awesome boards of Brown-Dogg's on display. Just like Cresent Old Mal Titles in September, it's a gathering of the clans. A great catch up with distant mates and above all else it's an enjoyable time where the competition in the water comes second to the atmosphere of the day.













It's no secret that I love Old Mal surfing and log riding. But this year saw the introduction of an Over 40's Log division, to separate from the younger fella's in the Open.

The result equalled brilliant surfing across the board in both divisions. You could have taken the 6 finalist out of these divisions and replaced them with the next 6 placed guys/ girls in the semi's and had equally as much of an electric final.

As for the Old Mal divisions, well Bellambi was not its normal, manageable self on this day. The outside section was tricky and there was the choice of catching the bombs or more workable medium sized waves. Bottom turns and big cutbacks were par for the first section. The 4-step and hang 'em over was reserved only for the committed outside, or left till the more accessible inside wall over the reef. It was nice to see this place surfed in such a way as opposed to what we expect. Plus lefts, oh Scotty, Dunny, Jye, how about those lefts! The goofy-footers were loving it and providing some of the best rides of the day before a last minute flick off just shy of the pool wall. Scotty scored the barrel of the year on one particular left, a special feat at Belza, cause they sure don't happen too often.
